## About Camp Heritage

Camp Heritage is located on the Lake of the Ozarks in central Missouri near the town of Climax Springs. Camp Heritage is a Christian camp, operated by the Iowa-Missouri Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. Registrations are accepted from boys and girls ages 7-17 without regard to race or religion.

## Camp Fees

Fees include lodging, meals, activities, secondary accident insurance, 24-hour camper supervision, and cabin photo.

## Iowa Shuttle

A shuttle operates between Camp Heritage and Des Moines on Sundays. Shuttle pick-up/drop-off time is 12:00 noon at the Des Moines Adventist Church, 2317 Watrous Ave, Des Moines, IA 50321. Fares are \$35 each way (\$70 round trip). Space is limited so reservations are required. Other pick-up/drop-off locations along the Hwy 65 corridor may be arranged.

## Activities

We offer archery, canoeing, ceramics, Christian acting, crafts, digital photography, fishing, geocaching, group games, gymnastics, horsemanship, model rocketry, nature, outdoor skills, recreational basketball, rock climbing, skateboarding, swimming, wakeboarding, wake surfing, and water skiing. The earlier you register, the more likely you will get your first choice!

Your camper will enjoy three healthy, kid-friendly, vegetarian (meatless) meals each day. Special requests for allergies/intolerances may be accommodated.



## Accommodations

Campers share a cabin with up to 7 other campers (5 for Cub Camp) and a counselor. Cabins are carpeted and have air conditioning. Bathrooms and showers are located in a nearby bathhouse in each village.

As long as it is age appropriate, we accept requests for campers to stay multiple weeks. Free laundry service is provided for campers who stay more than one week.

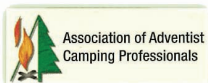
